

We're You Need to Know About **Preventive Dental Coverage**

In-Network (HMO & PPO): 0% coinsurance | Out-of-Network* (PPO): 30% coinsurance

Preventive dental procedures are provided by or under the supervision of a dentist in the practice of his/her profession, including treatment of the teeth and associated structure of the oral cavity.

Common preventive dental services include:

- **Prophylaxis (cleaning):** 2 per 12 months is in-office dental procedure which involves cleaning mineralized buildups of bacteria-rich plaque (also known as calculus). Some may refer to this procedure as a scale and polish.
- Fluoride Treatment: 2 per 12 months helps rebuild tooth enamel and reverse early signs of tooth decay.
- **Dental X-Rays (Bitewing X-Rays):** 1 per 12 months dental radiographs (X-Rays) to identify oral damage or disease that they cannot view during a clinical examination.
- Oral Exams: 2 per 12 months.
- And office visits.

What You Need to Know About Comprehensive Dental Coverage

Medicare Part A will pay for certain dental services that a beneficiary receives when they're in a hospital. Medicare can pay for hospital stays if a beneficiary needs to have an emergency or complicated dental procedure.

Comprehensive dental diagnostic or corrective procedures are provided by or under the supervision of a dentist in the practice of his/her profession, including treatment of the teeth and associated structures or the oral cavity; and disease, injury, or impairment that may affect the oral or general health of the recipient.

Common comprehensive procedures may include:

- Non-routine dental care.
- Diagnostic services.
- Restorative procedures: Fillings: 1 per tooth, 1 per 24 months, Crowns: 1 per tooth every 60 months & implants: 1 per 60 months per tooth is the term dental professionals use to explain how they replace missing or damaged teeth, Fillings, crowns ("caps"), bridges and implants are common restorative options. The goal is to bring back your natural smile and prevent future oral health issues. That is why restorative dentistry procedures are important.
- **Endodontics**: <u>Root canal</u>: 1 per tooth per lifetime dentistry concerning dental pulp and tissues surrounding the roots of a tooth.
- **Periodontics:** 1 per quadrant per 36 months encompasses the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of diseases of the supporting and surrounding tissues of the teeth or their substitutes and the maintenance of the health, function and esthetics of these structures and tissue.
- Extractions: 1 per tooth per lifetime procedure during which your tooth is completely removed from its socket.
- **Prosthodontics:** <u>Dentures:</u> 1 per 60 months deals with the replacement of missing teeth related mouth or jaw structures by bridges, dentures, or prosthesis.
